



Side-effects of new treatment options

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Time before treatment options for ACH

- Focus on acceptance, individual medical aspects
- General acceptance seeing a specialist once a year
 - Also possible on the annual conventions of my organization
- General agreement on centralized care
 - Doctors, organization and community!
- Interest in potential pharmaceutical options was high
 - Update at every annual meeting
 - Self-medication with off-label substances





Visible effects after 3 years

- Acceptance is very high
 - Few side effects
 - Differences in response to treatment
- New interest in the condition
 - More research
 - More treatment options are in development
- New medical burden
 - Label requires visits every 3-6 months
 - Many clinics want closer monitoring





- Centralized care is being questioned
- Local clinics start treatment
- Especially in smaller clinics
 - Absence of binding protocol results in very different care
 - Unnecessary examinations are increasing
 - Some clinics reach out to us to get information
 - Focus on height in medical communication





Side-effects on families

- Immediate start of treatment reduces possibility to cope
- Treatment is sometimes regarded as "cure"
 - Possibility to ignore the condition
- Response is compared in social media
 - Misinterpretation of data (absolute/relative growth)
 - New pressure on families
- Focus on height neglects other needs



Side-effects for my patient organization

- Generation before/after treatment option
 - Participant at our conference to his younger child: "Take the drug so that you don't have to look like them."

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- Expectations of parents are very high
 - Hope vs. available data
 - Imagination of average height parents regarding dwarfism
- New families feel less need to connect to the community
- Reaching out to more clinics and paediatricians adds workload on us



Conclusion

- Availability of the first pharmaceutical treatment option has changed our landscape tremendously
- There are many positive issues, such as research
- Some side-effects have a potential to worsen existing care
- Additional treatment burden increases already high pressure of the families
